

# PATTERN DARNING BOOKMARKS

## MATERIALS FOR THIS PROJECT:

Aida\* cloth, 14 count (scraps work well)

Pearl cotton #5 for 14 count material

Tapestry needle size # 22

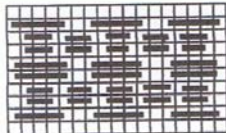
\*Any even weave material, fabric or canvas, may be used and the size of the thread is determined by the tightness of the fabric weave.

## STITCHING:

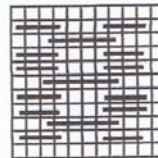
1. Choose a thread that will be a contrast to the material color
  2. The amount of thread that is needed can be determined by the length of the bookmark, then multiply by the number of rows. Add about 6 inches; cut.
  3. Work each row right to left.
- Some designs need to be centered, if so follow the directions below.
4. Mark the center of the cloth- both ways.
  5. Determine what part of the design you wish to be centered.
  6. Work center row from center of design to edges; cut thread allowing for fringe.
  7. Work rows top and bottom of center. Work each row right to left.

## FINISHING:

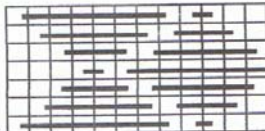
1. Leave at least 3 threads on all sides before stitching around the design per instruction in the next step.
2. Machine stitch a very short zig-zag stitch over 2 rows of aida material. Turn at the fringe, then straight stitch a very short length stitch across the fringe. Repeat on the other two sides. (You can use a stabilizing liquid in place of sewing or a backstitch or fringe stitch may be used.)
3. Wash bookmark in warm water and mild detergent. Rinse. Press dry. Washing tightens up the fabric and thread because the material shrinks slightly.
4. Pull vertical and horizontal fabric threads out to create the fringe.
5. Trim ends even.



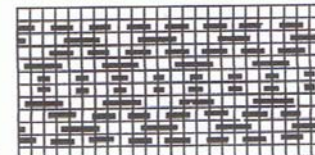

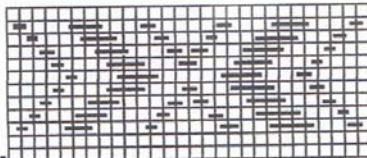

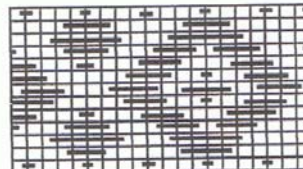
